- Main objective: improvement of resource efficiency (RE) in industrial SMEs
- June 2012 November 2014 (2.5 years)








RE Relevance

Cost structure in industrial SMEs (Germany)



Many SMEs are not aware of their cost structure!





RE: a challenging Business

- Increasing material productivity (GDP/DMI) mandatory!
- Germany: doubling by 2020 (compared to 1994)
- Actual value 2010: -40% (nominal value: -53%)
- Industrial sector (DE): ~190,000 SMEs
- ~21% (40,000) open to efficiency consultancy
- ZRE: 600 consultations/year
 - → 60 years to complete 40,000 companies




Work packages Overview

- Main goal: Reduction of resource use and cost in SMEs
- WP 3: Establishment of the tool <u>E</u>co-<u>I</u>nnovation
 <u>D</u>evelopment and <u>I</u>mplementation <u>T</u>ool for increase of enterprise <u>Value</u> (EDIT Value)
- WP 4: Financing issues of RE (public and private financing opportunities)
- WP 5: Establishment of an RE Competence Platform



EDIT Value (WP 3)



- Holistic approach: the entire SME is considered for RE potentials
- Integrated approach: SME need-driven instead of tool-driven
- Piloting phase in SMEs (starting February 2014)





RE Financing (WP 4)

- Financing market & stakeholder analysis
- Interviews with stakeholders
- Cost-benefit analysis scheme for the assessment of resource efficiency measures for financing institutions (lenders, i.e. banks)
- Financial Guideline for SMEs: financing of RE projects (public and private)




PRESOURCE RE Competence Platform (WP 5)

- WP 5: Establishment of an RE Competence Platform
- Online platform:
 - Mapping of stakeholders and activities in Central Europe
 - Networking between the stakeholders
 - Exchange of experience between politics and intermediaries
 - Collection of studies, tools; event calender
 - support for establishment of RE programmes, action plans, etc.
 - Transnational Workshops
 - RE Action Plan Development (5th-6th February, Prague)
 - Promotion of RE in SMEs Tools and Experiences (8th April, Berlin)
 - Financing of RE Measures (3rd June, Berlin)
